GENERAL INFORMATION: NANTAHALA GORGE AND BRYSON CITY, USA

The Nantahala Gorge is located in Swain County, 13 miles outside of the county seat: Bryson City, North Carolina. Named among the top 10 paddling towns in the nation, Bryson City is nestled at the foot of Great Smoky Mountains National Park, the most visited National Park in the United States, and famous for the mist that settles in its valleys as well a rich biodiversity of vegetation and wildlife. The area is a popular tourist destination, and is renowned for a wide variety of outdoor recreation opportunities including rafting and paddlesports, biking, zip lining, rock climbing, horseback riding, hiking and camping.



The region is also rich in cultural and historical significance. An important tribal area for the Cherokee people, many rivers, mountains and other landmarks still bear their Cherokee names. The word Nantahala, for example, means "Land of the Noon-day Sun." Today, Cherokee arts and crafts, as well as other traditional crafts, can be found throughout the region. For those looking for some contemporary culture, Swain County offers numerous restaurants, bars, artist's studios and galleries. Live music, including the traditional bluegrass that the area is known for, is scheduled nightly for the week of the event at multiple locations.

Swain County Area: 541 sq. miles (1,400 km²)

Population: 12,968 (as of 2000)

Geographic location: 35°25′37″N 83°26′52″W

Time Zone: North Carolina is located on the east coast of the United States, and is in the US Eastern Standard Time Zone (EST). EST is five hours behind Greenwich Mean Time (GMT-5). During the summer months, when daylight savings time is observed, EDT is moved one hour forward, while GMT remains the same (GMT-4).

Bryson City elevation: 1736 feet (529 m)

Highest Point in the County: Clingmans Dome, a popular tourist destination, has an elevation of 6,643 feet (2024.8 m)

Climate: Beginning in September, clear skies and cooler weather signal the onset of the fall color season. In early September, daytime temperatures often still reach into the 80° or 90°F (27° – 32°C), but can fall into the 60s (16°C). Nights will be cooler, with the first frost of the year often occurring in late September. This is the driest period of the year, during which the area sees only occasional rain showers.

Electricity: 150V

Telephones: The international dialing code for the United States is +1 (or 00 1). Emergency calls within the United States dial 911.

Healthcare: There are a number of public healthcare facilities in Swain County. The closest facility to the Nantahala Gorge is the Swain Medical Center, located in Bryson City. (Phone: 838.488.2155)

Visas: Some athletes and teams will need entry visas to visit the United States. To aid in the visa application process, USA Canoe/Kayak will draft a personalized letter of invitation for athletes and delegates, who will add this to the materials they present to the consulate or embassy. To obtain an invitation letter, the federation may write to: gerald@usack.org.

Customs Quotas & Regulations: Limits are set on the import of certain goods into the United States. All passengers arriving on an international flight will be asked to declare which goods they are bringing, and may be taxed on their items.

Embassies & Consulates: Your embassy will be able to offer assistance in case you encounter difficulty while you are in the United States. You may find a list of international embassies in the United States on the U.S. Department of State website.



International Airports: The recommended airport of the 2013 ICF Canoe Freestyle World Championships is **Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport**. This airport is relatively close to the venue, is able to accommodate kayaks, and often offers affordable rates from many international destinations. 

Because this is a rural area with little public transportation, athletes will need their own transportation to have the best possible experience during their stay in the United States. COMPETITION VENUE

The 2013 ICF Canoe Freestyle World Championships will be hosted at the Nantahala Outdoor Center, located in the Nantahala Gorge, 13 miles outside of Bryson City.

2013 Wave: The 2013 Wave is a challenging, dynamic feature especially constructed for the 2013 ICF Freestyle World Championships. During the 2012 Freestyle World Cup, both male and female athletes scored very high points, and were able to perform all ICF freestyle moves. Recent modifications to the feature will modify depth as well as retention.

Facilities: Accommodations at the Nantahala Outdoor Center include lodging, restaurants, exercise room, boat storage, running and biking trails. Please see Athlete Lodging section for lodging details.









ATHLETE ACCOMMODATION

Onsite Teams Lodging: NOC Basecamp – limited space is still available in the onsite bunk house . Cost is \$17/night per person.

Free Athlete Camping: Free athlete camping will be available on NOC property beginning August 26th. Athletes will have access to a shuttle to/from the event venue 3 times daily. Free kitchen and shower facilities provided.

ATHLETE MEAL PLAN

Athlete Meal Plan is available beginning August 26th. Two consecutive week-long meal plan packages are available. Athletes can choose to book one or both plans.

Dates: Monday, August 26 – Sunday, September 1

Monday, September 2 – Sunday, September 8

Includes: breakfast, lunch, dinner

Cost: \$130 (plus tax) per person for each week.

Meal Plans can be booked separately from lodging, but must be booked in advance. Last day to register for a Meal Plan is August 1.

Only athletes and official team support staff can purchase a Meal Plan. **No family or friends.** Meal Plans are non-refundable; there will be no refund for skipped meals.

TRAINING

Official Training period will begin on August 26, 2013 and end on September 1, 2013.

IMPORTANT – Teams must register by August 1 to be included on the Official Training schedule. Teams must be registered by the Team Captain or NF. To register, please email info@FreestyleKayaking2013.com with the following information: NF (country), dates of training, number of boats.

Training during the year: Training on the Nantahala is free. The Nantahala River is dam controlled, and will run every day during the summer of 2013. A Nantahala Scheduled Release Calendar is available HERE, and represents Minimum Guaranteed Release for each day. Athletes should be aware that it takes the water approximately 2.5 hours to stabilize at



the feature following the start of the release. It will begin to visibly subside approximately 2 hours following the end of the release.

Actual releases are often much longer than what the schedule above indicates. For an accurate three-day release forecast, please view Duke Energy's Flow Release Schedule.

Maximum # of boats: Varies per class, according to ICF Canoe Freestyle Competition Rules.

ACCREDITATION

Accreditation passes will be required to access on-campus parking, teams & competitor's areas.

Accreditation Fee is \$134.66 US per Athlete (Aa), Team Leader (AC), Technical Staff (Ao), Medical Staff (Am), or Team Assistants or other Delegates.

Accreditation can be paid via bank transfer or cash on arrival. Accreditations paid via bank transfer should arrive no later than August 26, 2013; all transaction costs are the responsibility of the NF.
